The Call for Nominations closes on December 22, 2023 and the selection of the candidate slate will be determined. The election will be held at a Members Only meeting during the Open House in January, 2024 with new Board Members taking office immediately. **Voting is** restricted to Members in good standing whose membership dues are paid prior to the meeting – one vote per Grower (farm).

You may nominate as many people as you like. Please submit one nomination form per candidate. We strongly encourage you to discuss your nomination with the candidate prior to submission to determine his or her interest and willingness to serve as a member of the NCBC Board.
